- Your child will have received their reading record and a school reading book. We will be assessing your child's reading regularly and moving their reading stages accordingly. This will be based on your child's fluency and their ability to answer comprehension questions on the text they are reading.
- Children should be encouraged to read for a minimum of 15 minutes every day. They will also have the opportunity to choose a 'reading for pleasure' book alongside their school
- Whilst hearing your child read every night, you could ask them questions such as:
 - What do you predict will happen next? Why?
 - How do you think the character is feeling?
 - Why do you think the character did that? 0
 - Are there any words you are unsure of?
 - Can you summarise what has happened so far?
