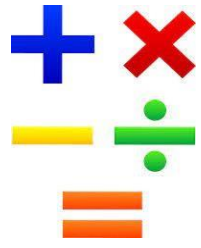
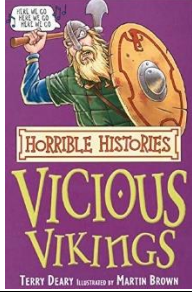
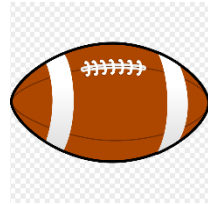
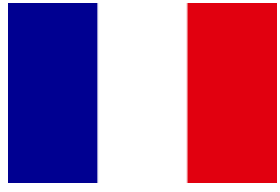
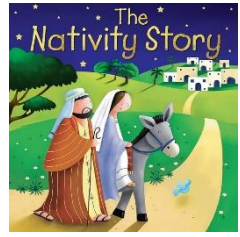


Year 5 Autumn Term Handout for Parents

Please find detailed below some information about the upcoming term in Year 5.

Learning in Year 5			
			
In English in Autumn 1, we will be reading Farther and The Giant's Necklace. In Autumn 2, we will be reading The Long Walk and Shackleton's Journey. In addition to reading activities, we will be writing diary entries, letters, newspaper reports, narratives and a recount.	In Maths, we will be covering place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division and fractions. Our KIRFs this term will focus on rounding to the nearest 10,100 and 1000 and factors and multiples.	In History, we will be using primary and secondary sources to explore the enquiry question - Are the Vikings really vicious?	In Science, we will be exploring the solar system as part of our Earth and Space topic. We will also be working scientifically to learn about different forces.
			
In PE, we will be playing invasion games, including Grid Rugby and Fives and Threes (Netball). We will be participating in Acrobatic Gymnastics and will also be creating our own dance with the theme – What's so funny?	In French, we will be learning to say, write and read the date (La Date) and discuss our family members (Ma Famille).	In Music, children will be taught by a specialist from Durham Music Service. All children will develop their musical skills by learning to play the cornet, trumpet or baritone. They will have the opportunity to share their success with performances during the school year.	In Art, we will be looking at the work of Claude Monet and will be inspired to create our own water colour painting.
			
In Autumn, we start the year by learning about systems and search engines work as well as learning different styles of shots to make effective videos. In Digital Citizenship, we talk about how to keep online games fun and friendly as well as thinking deeply about the tracks we leave when we're online.	In Geography, we will be comparing how Seaham is different to the Alps. We will be completing fieldwork in the local area and comparing our findings with the tourist destination of Innsbruck.	In RE in Autumn, we will be learning about Moses and why Jewish people go the synagogue. In our Christmas unit, we will be considering the meaning of Christmas.	In PSHE in Autumn term, we will be focusing on the topics 'Me and My Relationships' and 'Valuing Difference'.

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Reading



- Your child will have received their reading record and a school reading book. We will be assessing your child's reading regularly and moving their reading stages accordingly. This will be based on your child's fluency and their ability to answer comprehension questions on the text they are reading.
- Children should be encouraged to read for a minimum of 15 minutes every day. They will also have the opportunity to choose a 'reading for pleasure' book alongside their school book.
- Whilst hearing your child read every night, you could ask them questions such as:
 - What do you predict will happen next? Why?
 - How do you think the character is feeling?
 - Why do you think the character did that?
 - Are there any words you are unsure of?
 - Can you summarise what has happened so far?

- Spellings will be sent home on a Monday. The children will be tested on a Friday. It is vital that children learn their spellings so that they can apply them accurately in their writing.
